



Using the Long Reach Hedge Trimmer

- Wear ALL of your protective equipment, then put the shoulder strap on.
- Make sure that you have got a firm footing, and that there is no danger of you slipping or stumbling while working.
- Start the hedge trimmer, then lift it and clip in onto the shoulder strap.
- Make sure that the cutting blades do not accidentally touch anything. If they do, the hedge trimmer may kick back or cause an injury.
- Always keep your left hand on the grip on the shaft, with your right hand on the control handle, controlling the throttle.
- Let the shoulder harness carry the weight of the machine – this makes it easier to handle and control.
- Make sure the cutting blade is running at full speed before starting to cut into the hedge.
- Do not try to cut off thick twigs. This hedge trimmer is only for trimming foliage.
- Do not try to cut off all growth in one pass: remove it one layer at a time. Make sure that you can control the amount you are removing before you take off the final layer.
- Work with a steady swinging action from the bottom upwards when trimming hedge sides.
- Beware of debris that may be thrown out by the trimming blade.
- If the hedge trimmer starts to labour and slow down, do not force it so hard. Work at a steady speed so as not to overload the engine.
- If anything jams in the blades while you are working, stop the machine and put it down. Wait until the blades have stopped completely before clearing the obstruction.
- Do not cut close to the ground – stones and other debris can be thrown up, and the blades can be blunted.
- Make sure that your work area remains clear – you may need to stop the hedge trimmer to move fallen material.
- Stop the hedge trimmer before you put it down, or if you need to carry it anywhere. Put the blade cover back on.
- The gearbox by the cutting blade can get hot after continuous use – be careful not to touch it.
- You should always be alert when using the hedge trimmer. If you are tired, leave the job until another day.
- Stop the engine if leaving the machine unattended.
- Put the blade cover back on when you have finished work.
- If your equipment does not work properly, do not attempt to repair it. Contact the hire company.

ONCE THE HEDGE TRIMMER IS RUNNING

2. Check that the hedge trimmer stops properly.
3. Move the control lever to the throttle position and stop when the hedge trimmer blades run freely, and stop when the hedge trimmer control is released.

1. Check that the hedge trimmer may have a decompression valve. This is only used when starting the hedge trimmer – it needs to be pressed before stroke oil to 25 measures of petrol (40ml per litre).

4. Your machine may have a decompression valve. This is used to draw fuel from the fuel tank when you first start the machine from cold.

5. Your machine may have a fuel primer bulb. Lever towards the STOP position.

6. Under normal running it is at the RUN position. To stop the hedge trimmer, pull the control lever towards the RUN position.

7. The main control lever has two positions. Under normal running it is at the RUN position. To stop the hedge trimmer, pull the control lever towards the RUN position.

8. Slowly turn your right hand, pull out the starter handle and turn the body of the machine.

9. Gently pull the cord back into place so that it reaches correctly.

10. In cold weather you may need to let the engine warm up by gently opening the throttle, before starting work.

11. In cold weather you may need to let the engine run until you feel that the starter has started to normal running position.

12. Once the engine is now running, set the choke control to normal running position.

13. Turn the control lever back to the idle position. Gently pull the cord back into place so that it reaches correctly.

14. Place the hedge trimmer firmly within your left hand on the ground. Take off the blade cover and make sure that the blade is not touching the ground or any obstacles.
