

Using the Small Dumper

- Be aware of your work environment and ground conditions at all times. Do not assume that other persons or obstacles will move out of your way.
- Stay on the driver's seat unless parked. Do not lean out to move obstacles or give assistance. Ensure the seat belt is used, unless working by water and a risk assessment states differently.
- Ensure the brake is applied when stationary or the dumper may creep or roll without being noticed.
- Avoid hazardous areas such as soft or frozen ground, trenches or overhead cable
- Be careful on slopes avoid turning on them if possible taking additional care when the dumpers skip is empty. Follow the weight to the sky guidance, observing manufacturers warning decals.
- Never carry passengers on any part of the
- Never move the dumper near to any trench/area where workers are operating.
- If the dumper is being loaded, either by hand or by machine the operator must never stay seated and should move to a safe distance away from the dumper.
- Do not exceed the dumper's load capacity. This can cause the dumper to become unstable. Ensure loads are levelled in accordance with manufacturers guidance / safety decals.

- 10. Always stop on firm, level ground away from the work area and other traffic.
- Stop the engine, apply the parking brake and remove the key before leaving the dumper unattended.
- If the equipment does not work properly. do not attempt to repair it. Contact the hire company.
- If the machine is fitted with a ROPs (roll over protection system) frame, in order to maintain operator safety, in the event of either the dumper tipping or rolling over, the operator must remain in the seat. holding the steering wheel firmly with both hands. Ensure the seat belt is used, unless working by water and a risk assessment states differently.

STOPPING THE ENGINE

- Always use the engine STOP control to stop the engine.
- Do not use the decompression lever (if fitted), this will damage the engine.
- Remember to turn off and remove the ignition key if there is one, to prevent unauthorised use. Where fitted, the battery isolator key can also be removed.

Small Dumper

The rules and procedures in force where people are at work may require the person responsible for this equipment to carry out a specific risk assessment.

It is important to read all of this leaflet BEFORE using the small dumper.

- Plan work and think ahead to ensure work will always be carried out
- Diesel fuel is flammable. Take care not to cause a fire or explosion.
- The small dumper is designed to transport skip loads of building material such as hardcore and sand over short distances, usually within a building site. Its skip can also be hand loaded with bags of cement, bricks and similar items. Ensure that the Safe Working Load (SWL) is not exceeded, and

loads are levelled in accordance with manufacturers guidance The action of the dumper can cause injury or damage if the equipment is not used in a careful and

- controlled way. Do not drive the dumper unless you have had previous experience, or you have had a course of
- instruction from a responsible body. Drivers of this vehicle should have at least a current site safety awareness certificate.
- Recognised training is available via CPCS (Construction Plant Competence Scheme) and/or NPORS/ CSCS (National Plant Operators Registration Scheme) or equivalent. Do not attempt to load or unload the machine from a truck or trailer unless fully experienced in doing so.
- The following items of personal protective equipment are the minimum required: safety helmet; safety boots; high visibility vest or similar reflective garment; ear defenders. This equipment is likely to cause noise levels up to 101 dB(A). You should pick ear defenders or ear plugs that can be shown to give enough protection to limit the risk of hearing loss. You may need to check that the ear defenders

you pick do not make things too quiet. When ear defenders or ear plugs are too good, they make it

- The dumper must not be used by young persons or by anyone under the influence of alcohol or druas.
- The dumper is designed for operation by an able-bodied adult. Anyone with either a temporary or permanent disability must seek expert advice before using the machine.

Additional safety devices (such as cameras, reversing alarm, lights) must be used when fitted.

When using the dumper the operator should take into account environmental conditions such as weather (heat/cold/rain), dust, light.

The maximum weight loading stated on the machine must not be exceeded. Ensure loads are levelled in accordance with manufacturers guidance/safely decals.

Care must be taken not to exceed the slope/gradient capacity stated on the machine when working on uneven ground.

The operator must wear the lap-belt at ALL times unless a risk assessment denotes differently, i.e. when working by water.

Check the dumper each time it is used. It will have been supplied in good condition and ready to use by the hine company –ensure that it has not been damaged or aftered in any way since them.

Check the machine, engine, tyres, skip and all equipment. Do not use anything found to be damaged – contact the hire company.
